#### Policy:

Admission to undergraduate studies at OCAD University is based on a combination of academic preparedness and the results of an interview, assessment of a written submission and/or portfolio review. Top ranked candidates receive an offer of admission.

## **Academic Requirements**

Applicants must meet one of the following minimum academic requirements to qualify for admission to an undergraduate program at OCAD University:

### 1. Ontario High School Curriculum Applicants

Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) with at least six Grade 12 U or M courses with a minimum 70% average and including Grade 12 U English (ENG4U or EAE4U) with a minimum final grade of 70%; if first language is not English and if 4 full years of high school were not completed in an approved Ontario high school, must submit additional proof of proficiency in English (see "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English" below).

#### 2. Canadian High School Curriculum Applicants from outside Ontario

Grade 12 High School Diploma or CEGEP equivalent with minimum average of 70% in university preparatory courses and including an approved senior level English course with a minimum grade of 70%. Approved senior level English courses are listed on the OCAD University website. If first language is not English and if 4 full years of high school were not completed in a Canadian school, must submit additional proof of proficiency in English (see "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English" below).

#### 3. International High School Applicants

High school graduation, equivalent to grade 12 in Ontario, with a 70% (or letter grade equivalent) average in the final year and including an English 12 or equivalent course with a minimum grade of 70% (or letter grade equivalent); If English was not the official language of instruction or if 4 full years of high school were not completed in the English language, must submit additional proof of proficiency in English (see "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English" below).

#### 4. International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Applicants

Successful completion of the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma including 3 Higher Level and 3 Standard Level subjects with a minimum of 24 points, including IB English with a final grade of 4 or higher; If English was not the official language of instruction or if 4 full years of high school were not completed in the English language, must submit additional proof of proficiency in English (see "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English" below); may be eligible for transfer credit as outlined in the Prior Learning Assessment, Undergraduate Policy

#### 5. Postsecondary Applicants

Completion of one or more years in good standing at an accredited post-secondary college or university program; must submit proof of proficiency in English (approved Grade 12 English or equivalent post-secondary course with a minimum final grade of 70% (only accepted if first language is English) *or* as outlined below in "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English"); may be eligible for transfer credit as outlined in the Prior Learning Assessment, Undergraduate Policy.

### 6. Non-traditional Applicants

Exempt from high school diploma requirements if not engaged in formal education for at least 2 years and 20 years of age by September 1 of the intended year of enrolment; must submit proof of proficiency in English (approved Grade 12 English with a minimum final grade of 70% (only accepted if first language is English) or as outlined below in "Additional Proof of Proficiency in English").

# Additional Proof of Proficiency in English

- 1. English Language Proficiency Tests: Applicants whose first language is not English and who have not completed at least four consecutive years of schooling immediately prior to commencement of studies at OCAD University in an approved accredited English language school system are required to submit successful English language proficiency test results. Approved tests and the required minimum scores are published on the OCAD University website.
- 2. **English Language School Partners:** Applicants may demonstrate proficiency in English by successfully completing an English language program at an approved partner institution. Approved English language school partner programs and required grades are published on the OCAD University website.
- 3. **English for Art & Design:** Applicants may demonstrate proficiency in English by successfully completing OCAD University's English language program.
