

An 'in-conversation' question period with Dr. Schalk featuring participation from OCAD U faculty and students will follow.






## Dr. Sami Schalk

Dr. Schalk is Associate Professor of Gender and Women's Studies at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. Her research focus is on disability, race, and gender in contemporary American Literature and culture.

Her recent book *Black Disability Politics* (Duke UP, 2022) explores how Black cultural workers have engaged disability as a social and political issue differently than the mainstream, white-dominated disability rights movement.
